Representative Matt Koleszar – Guest Speaker

Representative Koleszar is a member of the Michigan House of Representatives from the 22nd district, which includes Plymouth, Plymouth Twp., parts of Livonia, Northville, and Northville Twp. He was first elected in November 2018 and during his tenure has introduced legislation on issues ranging from air quality to school libraries, as well as tuition assistance for fallen police officers and fire fighters. He has served on the House committee for education, higher education, health policy, education policy, elections and ethics, labor, and school aid. He is also serving as chairperson of the education committee.



Rep. Koleszar earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in secondary education from Saginaw Valley State and a Master of Arts in English studies from Eastern Michigan University. Before he was elected to the House, he taught middle school and high school for 12 years in the Airport Community School District, coached cross country and baseball, and served as president of the Airport Education Association. He lives with his wife, Kimberly Bush-Koleszar and their rescue animals.

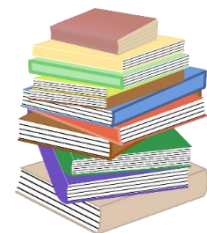
BOOK GROUP

As indicated in a recent AAUW press release:

“In just 100 days the Trump Administration has made one thing unmistakably clear: It is waging an aggressive campaign to dismantle higher education—impacting the very students who need it most. Women, students of color, low- income students LGBTQ, and students with disabilities are under attack.”

So, what does this mean? It means that civil rights protections have been gutted. It also means that student aid has been slashed, and academic freedom is under siege. The consequences of this are devastating, because doors slam shut and futures are dimmed. Many students will be left behind as a result of these decisions.

Shannon Wolfe, AAUW Managing Director and Chief of Staff, spoke to this issue and others at the AAUW of Michigan annual meeting on April 26th. Although AAUW still supports pay equity, reproductive rights, passage of the ERA, etc., the focus now is on protecting and responding to the attacks on education. As members, we cannot stay silent. We can do something:

- ☐ Speak up when you see attacks on equity.
- ☐ Engage in events like town halls, school board meetings, or public demonstrations.
- ☐ Contact local officials when legislation threatens equity in education. Use the Two Minute Activist!
- ☐ Support AAUW and other organizations working to protect our rights.
