Although many of our members just participated in elections on Tuesday, November 4th, it is never too early to start preparing for our next round of elections. As you know, AAUW has always encouraged voter registration and getting out the vote. Now AAUW is proud to be a Power Partner with the League of Women Voters on Unite and Rise 8.5, alongside the National Council of Jewish Women.

Unite and Rise 8.5 is the League of Women Voters' non-partisan, movement-building campaign to engage 8.5 million people in civic education, community activation, and turnout support with partners working together to lift local voices and make participation easier. Working together on this does not change AAUW'S strategic focus or our policy priorities. This partnership demonstrates overlapping goals around engaging people in elections—not an adoption of another organization's areas of priorities.

It's My Vote! Is AAUW's nonpartisan voter engagement effort to help branches lead meaningful, community-rooted civic education, public mobilization, and coalition building. The focus is practical: give leaders clear information, simple tools, and doable actions that strengthen participation and keep the conversation centered on women's equity.
