Dr. Whitehead is Associate Director of the Office for Teaching and Learning (OTL) and Adjunct Professor at Wayne State University. Beyond her professional career she is President of Michigan PTA and co-founder and President of *Pawsitive Impact for Pets*.

She received a bachelor's degree in computer engineering and a master's in manufacturing and engineering management from Michigan State University. Before pursuing a Ph.D. in Biomedical Engineering at Wayne State she spent several years in the IT services industry leading teams that supported hundreds of international and domestic clients. While completing her doctorate work, she discovered a passion for engineering education and faculty development. In addition to her role at OTL, she teaches introductory courses in engineering and participates in outreach activities through the college and Tau Beta Pi, the engineering honor society.

SUPPORT THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT!
THE ERA MUST BE PUBLISHED!

The ERA passed Congress with the needed 2/3 vote of the House and Senate as well as the legislatures of the needed 38 states. Congress must immediately recognize the Equal Rights Amendment and pass the following United States House and Senate resolution:

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that notwithstanding any time limit contained in House Joint Resolution 208, 92nd Congress, as agreed to in the Senate on March 22, 1972, the article of amendment proposed to the States in that joint resolution is valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution, having been ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States.

In January 2025 President Biden issued a strong statement declaring that the Equal Rights Amendment has been ratified and is the law of the land, having met both requirements of Article V with the vote of 2/3 of the Congress and ratification by 3/4 of the state legislatures. Now is the time for Congress to officially affirm ratification.

Make your voice heard and sign the petition. Sign4ERA. Thank you for supporting the Equal Rights Amendment!

GET TO KNOW MAH JONGG



If you play this Mah Jongg on the computer, it is not Mah Jongg – it is a matching game using MJ tiles.

Mah Jongg has its origins in China. In the last century it was made popular by Jewish women in the U.S., who simplified the rules and formed the National Mah Jongg Society. Recent studies have shown that playing MJ offers substantial cognitive benefits, including improved memory, cognitive flexibility, and slower rates of cognitive decline. Additionally, the social aspect of the game offers further mental health benefits by reducing feelings of loneliness. Mah Jongg is growing in popularity among both senior men and women and young people.

I will bring a Mah Jongg set to the September meeting to show and explain the basics of the game to anyone who is interested. It will be informal during the social time of the meeting. Then, for anyone who wants to know more, we will schedule a few lessons at my house.

By the way, the Northville-Novi branch has a Mah Jongg group which plays regularly and has two tournaments each year for fund-raisers. Who knows??? We may have enough to form an interest group.
